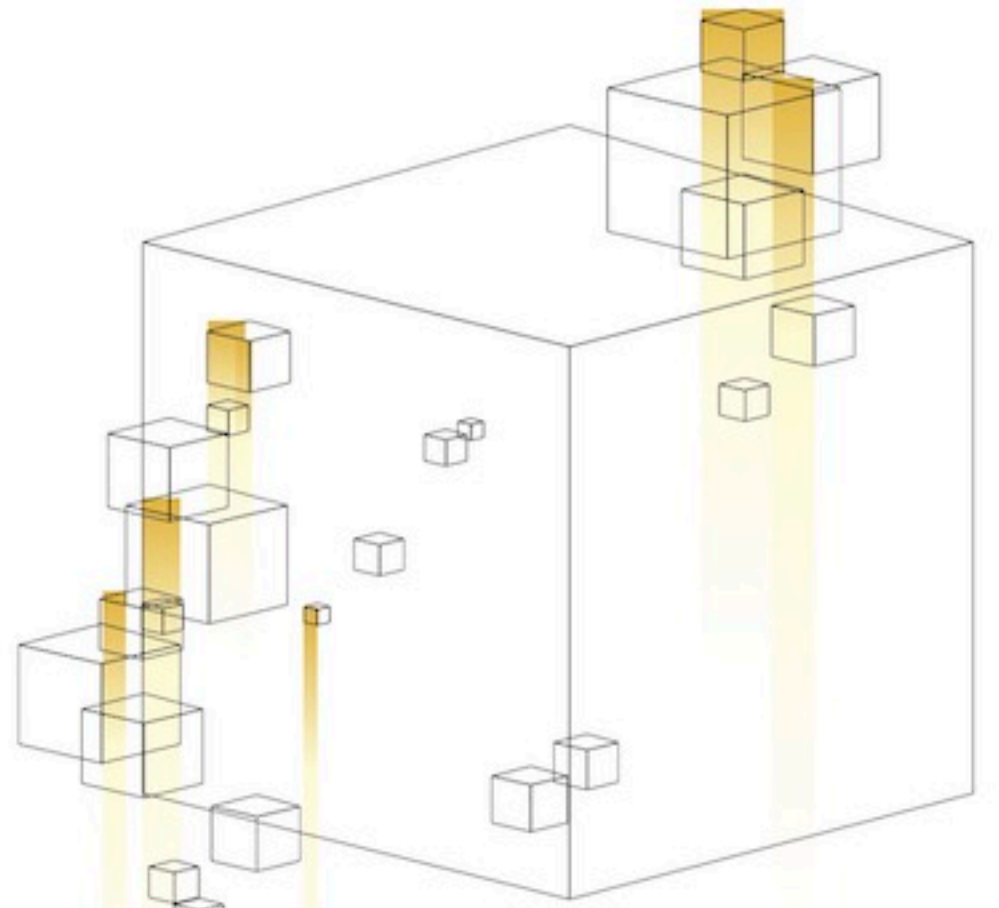




Memoey Box

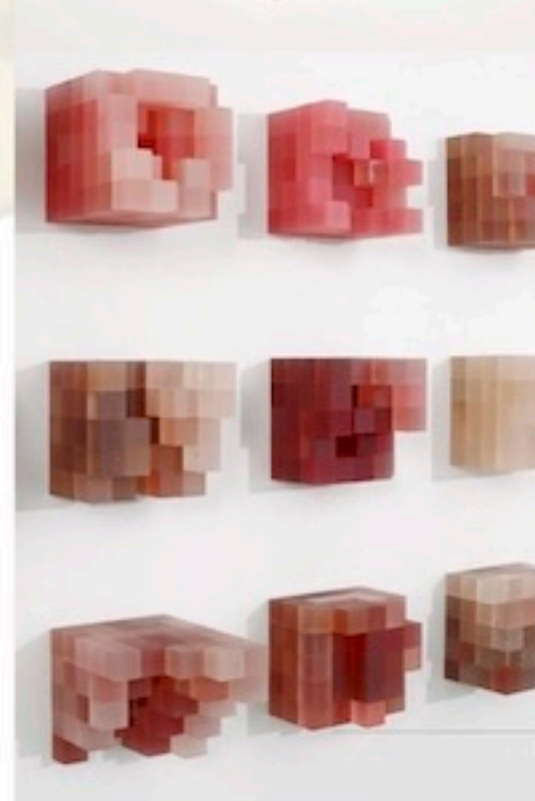
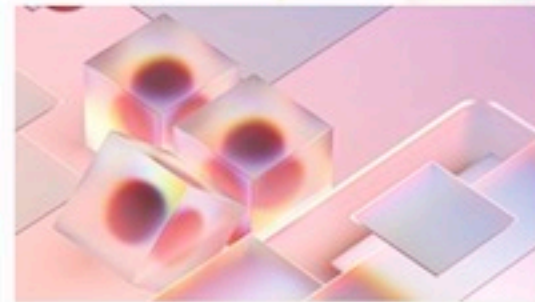
I think I should use one word to describe the graduation season - breaking the cocoon into a butterfly.

Structure and Translucent materials

I thought of the dust that accumulates when an object is left unused and forgotten, just like our memories, which get dimmer and dimmer over time when we don't recall them, or even some unimportant fragments that become blurred like an abstract painting.

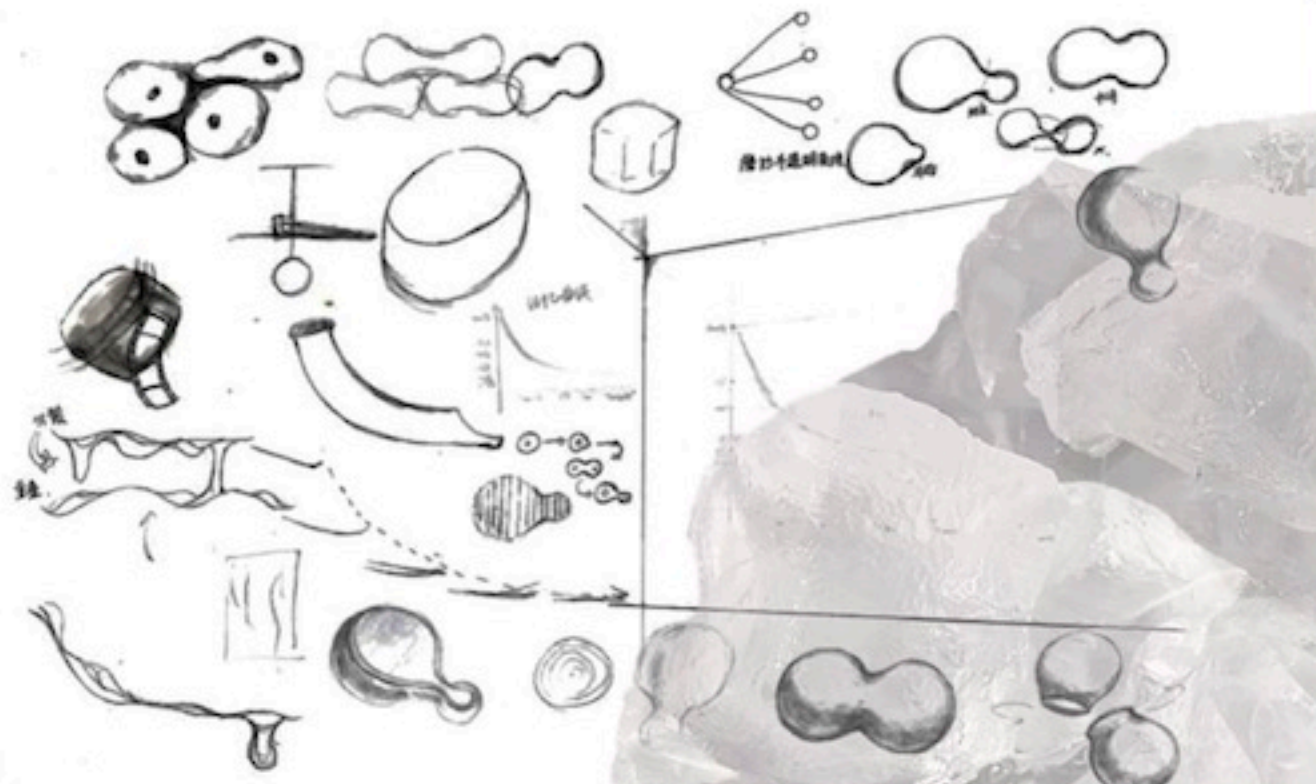
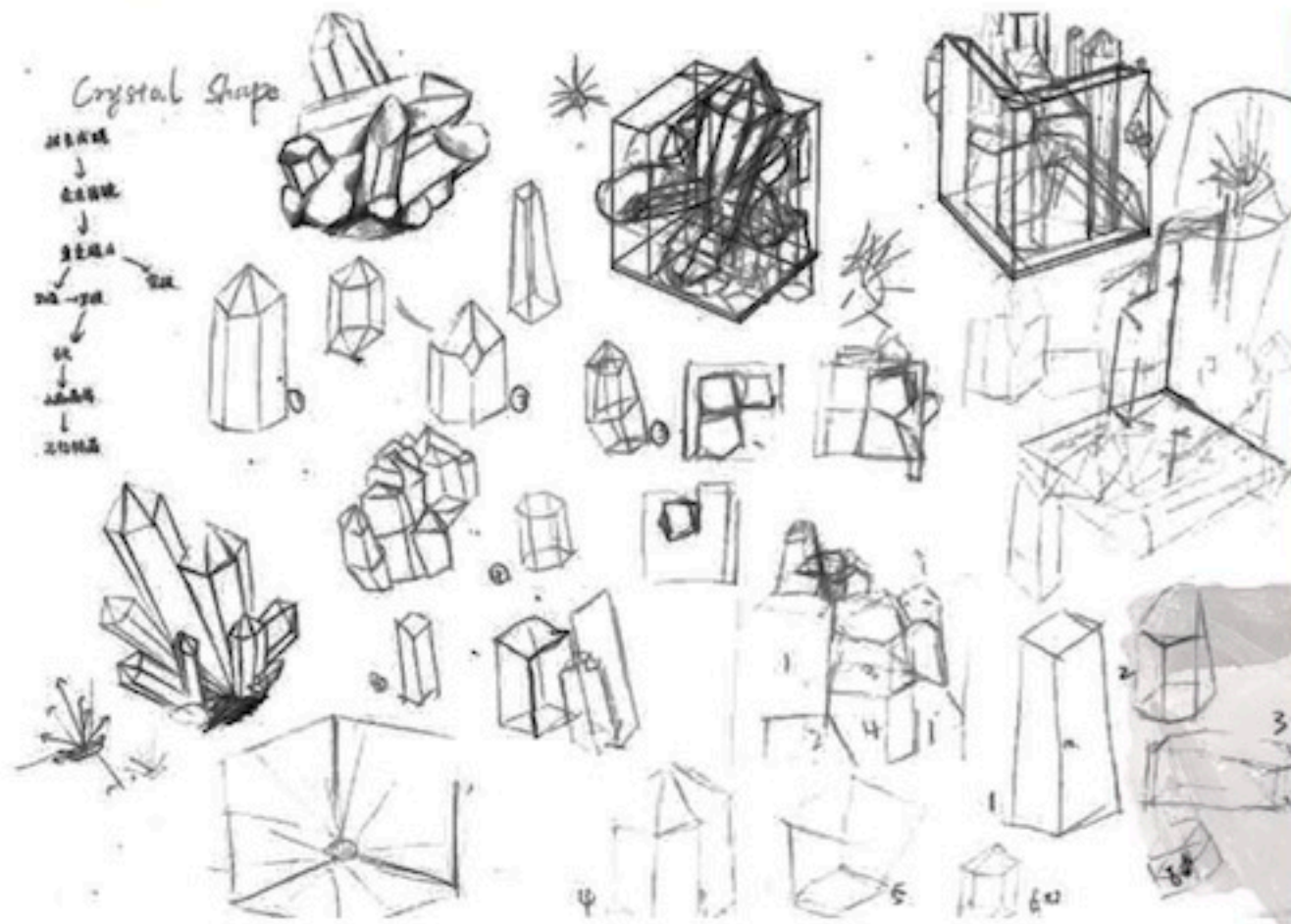

Ideas & Models

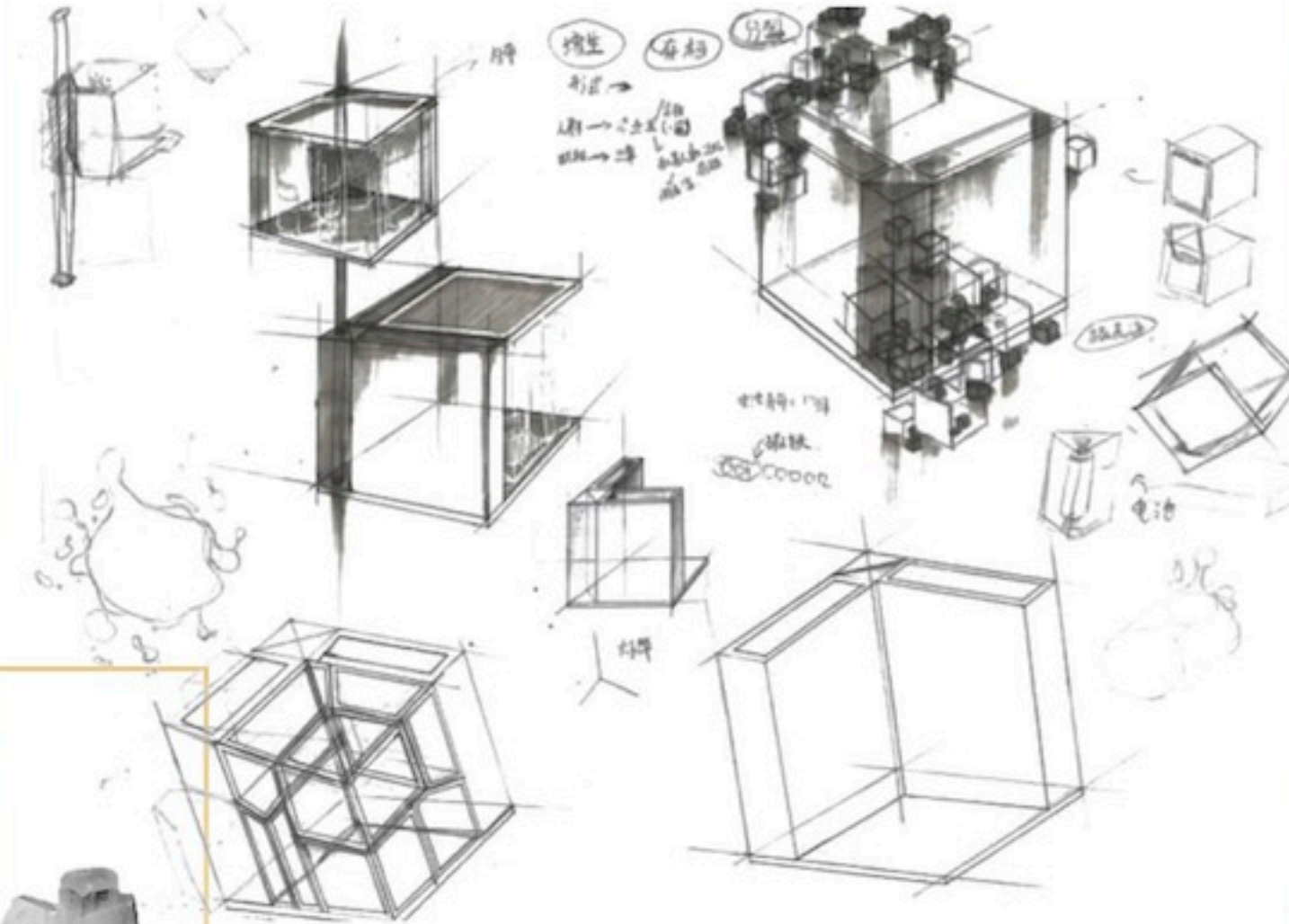
I searched through various crystal materials to determine the size and shape of my box design. the size and shape of the box.
