



























### CONCEPT






# MATERIAL EXPERIMENT

I was inspired by artist Leandro Erlich who made an installtion called The Swimming Pool. I want to create a space that can be observed in two different ways. One is a perspective of the audience, the other is to enter into this space by myself. When the upper layer is filled with water, audience might consider the whole glass case is filled with water but it is not.

I used 34D firstly created a virtual space as my little world. However, it failed due to technique problems. Therefore, I come up with the idea to create this space in reality.






## FINAL MAKING PROCESS

I made a glass case that has a layer of glass on the top which can contain water. Around the glass box, I first pasted a layer of tile glue, and then a layer of wire to better support the outermost layer of cement. Then I did my tiles. I bought a bag of clay, and the first time I rolled it out into flakes to dry, they all cracked because air was running in. So I dried them all, repounded them into powder, then added water and smoothing agent, poured them on the board to re-dry and let it naturally crack into many pieces.

After the clay was dried, I took it to the kiln and fired it. After cooking, I painted the pottery embryos one by one with cashew paint, and after coloring, I took them to the roof to dry. Ultimately, I used tile glue to stick them around the inside of the glass box.
